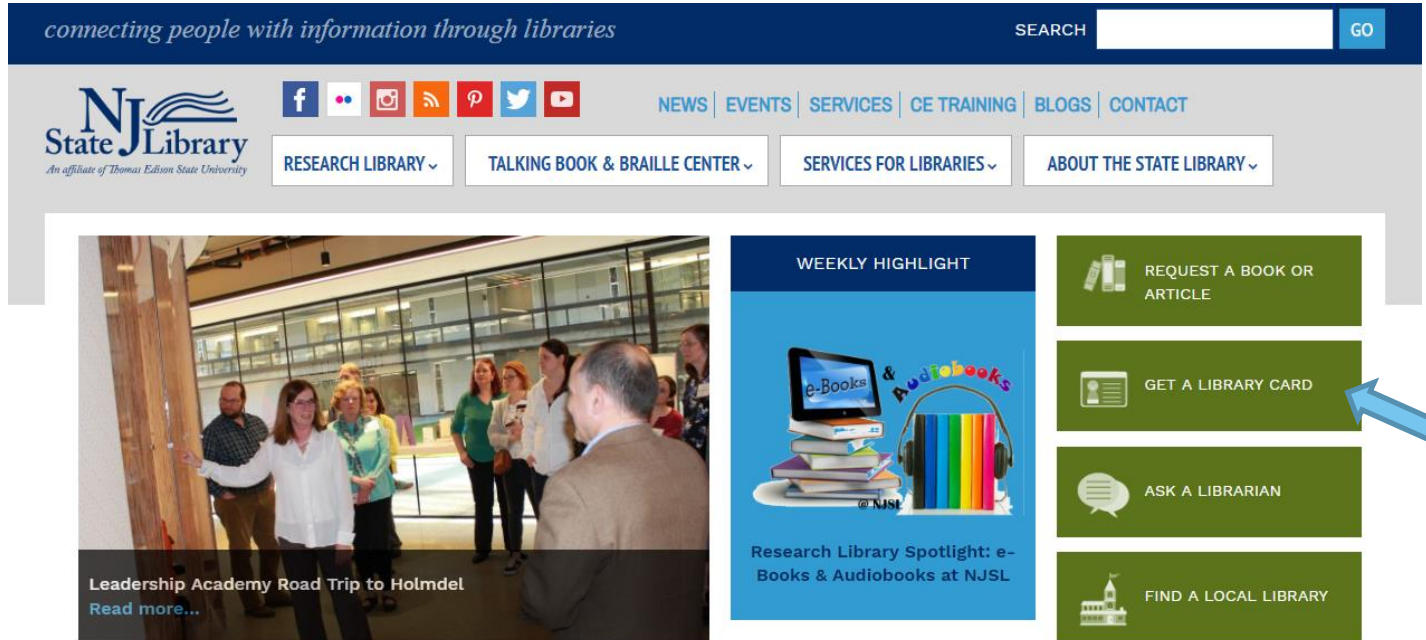

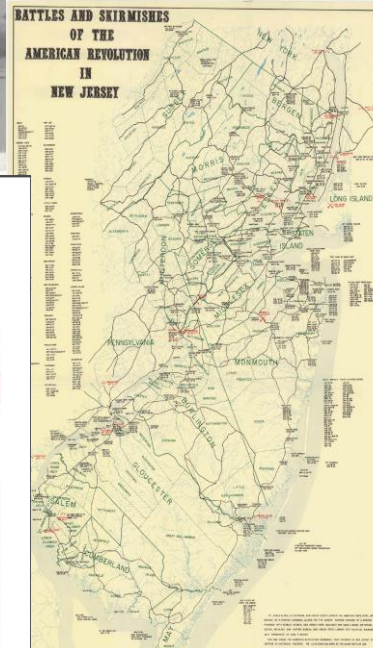

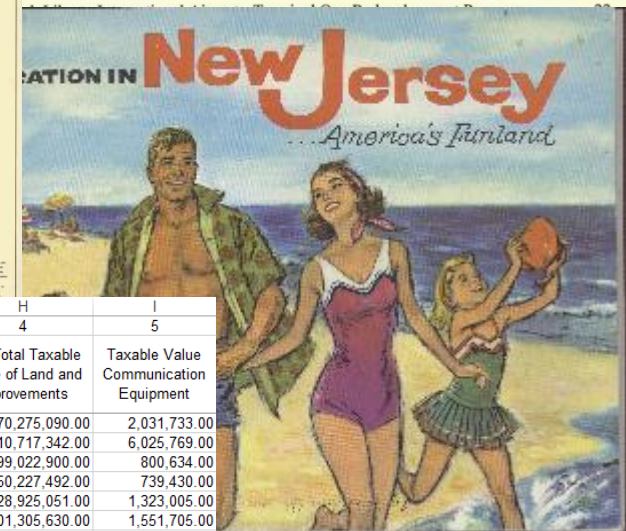
DHS Commissioner Johnson Recognizes Audiologists

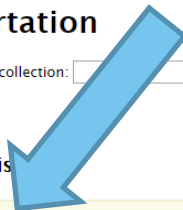

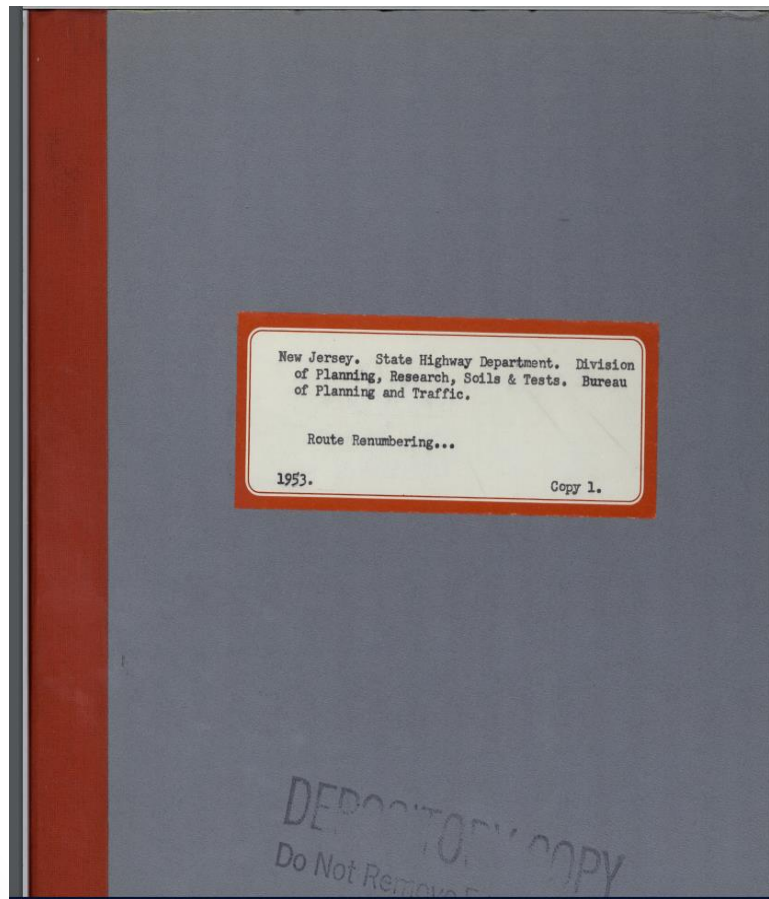

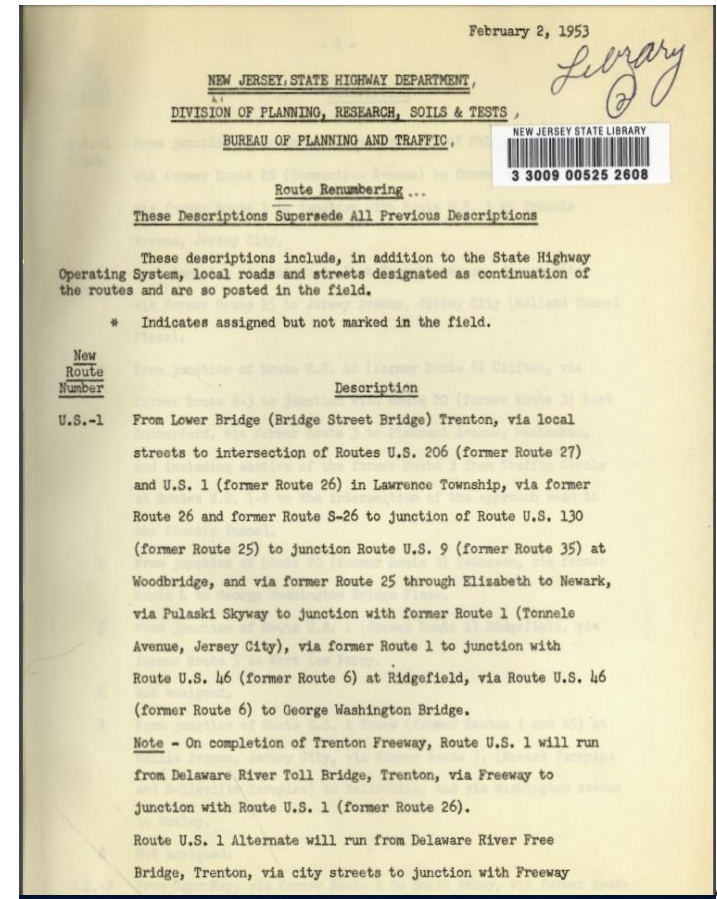


Scanned Document Route Renumbering - 1953

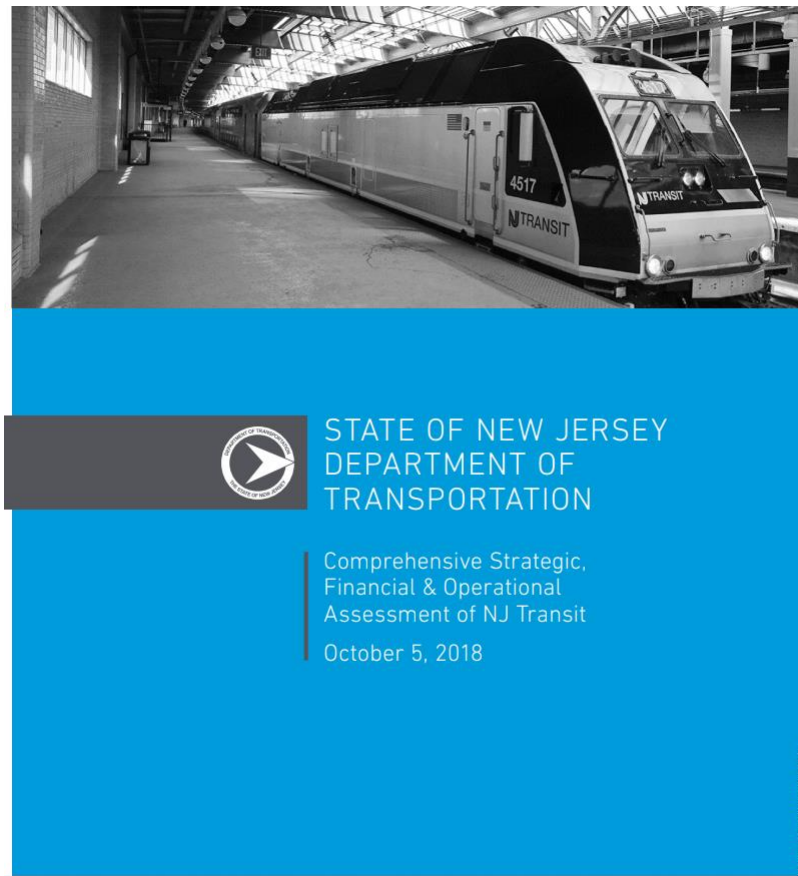

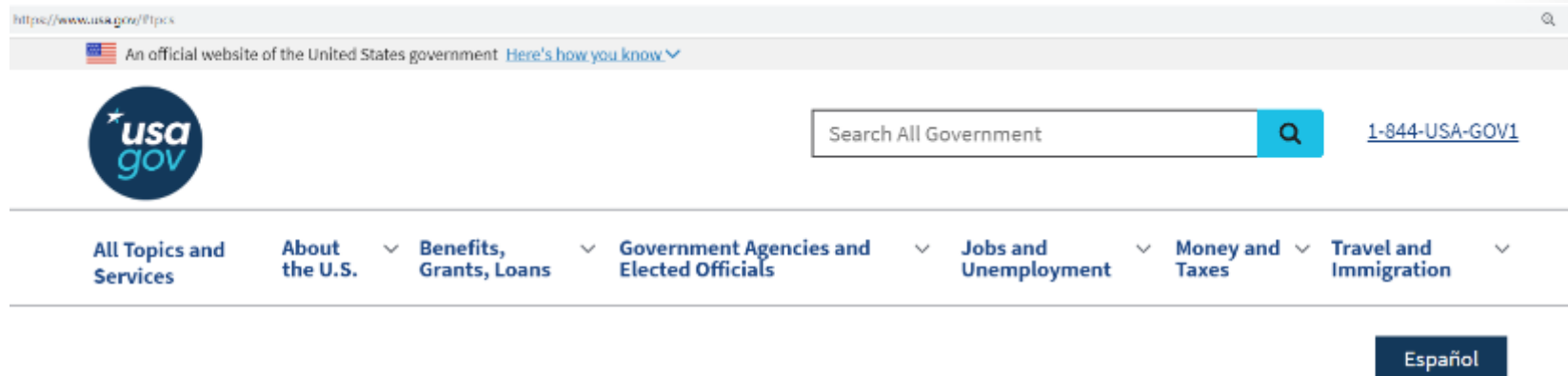

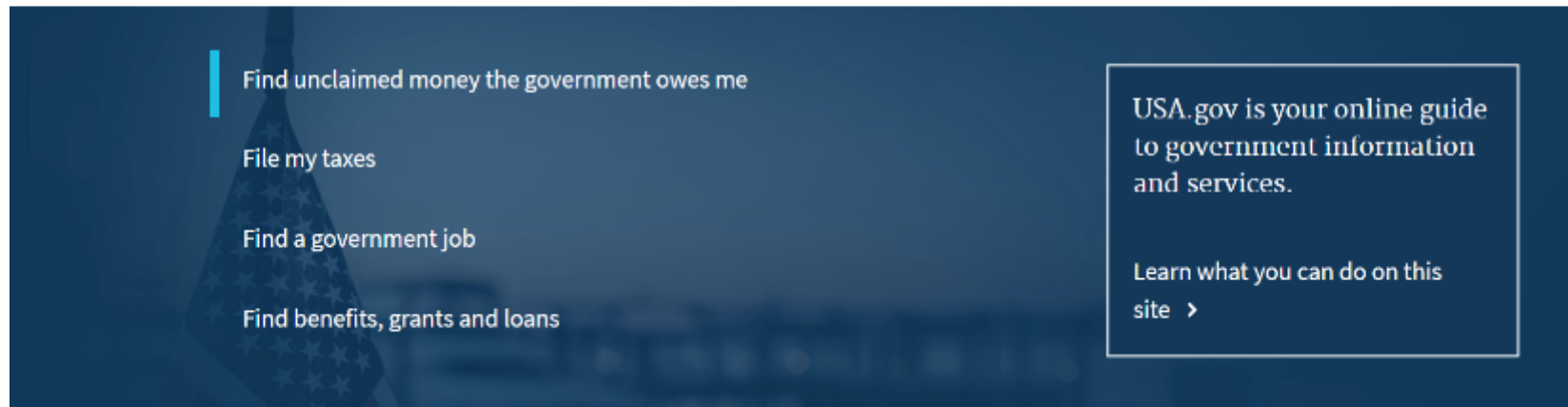
