




VPI Research

National Cooperative Highway Research Board (NCHRP) – Synthesis 538

Practices for Online Public Involvement (2019)

- Our work: Provide the current state of online public involvement tools used by state DOTs.
- VPI Online survey and informant interviews
- Key findings
 - Communicate efficiently and reach more people
 - Websites, blogs and social media most common tools
 - Supplement in-person outreach
 - Challenges digital divide, internet access, staffing




VPI Research

NCHRP 08-142

VPI: A Manual for Effective, Equitable, and Efficient Practices for Transportation Agencies (research underway)

- Phase 1 work: Research and guidance on VPI during the pandemic with DOTs and practitioners
- Phase 2 work Create a manual on VPI best practices through additional data collection from DOTs, practitioners, experts, and the public.

- Multilingual Outreach for South Jersey Transportation Planning Organization (SJTPO)
- Somerset County Communication & Outreach Assessment
- Middlesex County Destination 2040 Strategic Plan

Key takeaways

- No "one size fits all" experiment with social media, hybrid engagement,
- Welcoming and beneficial for participants part of decision making not just approving what is already decided.
- Build local partnerships and trust
- Targeted outreach work with community organizations and local libraries
- Social media and videos
- Multiple languages

Engaging with Underserved Populations

Interview Takeaways from Community Organizations & Social Service Agencies:

- Limit group size when working with populations needing technical support
- Offer assistance on virtual platforms
- Do not limit virtual engagement opportunities to web-based, offer "low-tech" & "no-tech" options
- Strong support for VPI for underserved populations as a means to promote connectivity and expand universe of participants
